April 8 - Solar Eclipse Day

On April 8, 2024, a total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. A total solar eclipse happens when the Moon passes between the Sun and Earth, completely blocking the face of the Sun. The sky will darken as if it were dawn or dusk.

Except during the brief total phase of a total solar eclipse, when the Moon completely blocks the Sun's bright face, it is not safe to look

directly at the Sun without specialized eye protection for solar viewing. For that reason, some schools plan to let out early so children can watch the eclipse with their family and others won't release kids until after the height of the eclipse. St. Francis will have a normal day of school in which we will learn about the eclipse. We will send students home with a pair of eclipse glasses; however, students will not be viewing the eclipse with us at the school. The height of the eclipse

happens at about 3:05 PM - after car riders are dismissed. The students that stay for After School Care, will go straight to the gym as usual.

If you want your child to view the eclipse you must sign your child out by 2PM that day. Although we are very excited about the eclipse, we want to be conscientious about each student's visual well-being too! We will operate on a regular schedule for this special day.
